Key Staff - Role Description

Every residential direct care staff will be assigned to serve as the Key Staff for 3-5 students in their dorm, to focus on dorm-based aspects of programming and to assist with some basic case management tasks. Key staff assess, monitor, and teach residents:

- 1. Activities of Daily Living (adl's):

 - Wearing clean clothing
 - o Skin Care
 - o Foot Care
 - Hair Care
 - Deodorant

 - Bedroom Care
 - Being organized
 - Being neat
 - Being clean
- 2. Dorm-based Reports:
 - Monthly Progress Reports (residential portion)
 - (DCYF/DJJS students) Independent Living Forms
- 3. Dorm-based Individualized Treatment Programming:
 - Personal hygiene programs
 - Room care programs
 - Relaxation programs
 - Coping skills programs
- 4. Independent Living Preparation
 - New Hampshire Trails
- 5. Family Visits
 - Confirming / establishing visit logistics based on Treatment Coordinator's plan •
- 6. Social Calls
 - Facilitating social calls •
- 7. Be an "expert" on their students issues and functioning:
 - Review psychosocial assessments, individual treatment plans, incident reports, and log • notes.
